COURSE OVERVIEW

This course equips learners with the knowledge and skills to effectively care for juvenile and young offenders in a correctional or residential setting. It focuses on understanding the unique developmental, psychological, and social needs of young offenders, and applying appropriate care strategies to support rehabilitation and reintegration.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

- Apply principles of youth development and trauma-informed care to support juvenile and young offenders.
- Analyze the legal and ethical frameworks governing the care of young offenders in South Africa.
- Implement individualized care plans that address the psychological, social, and educational needs of young offenders.
- Evaluate the effectiveness of intervention strategies in promoting rehabilitation and reducing recidivism.
- Demonstrate effective communication and conflict resolution skills when interacting with young offenders.
- Design a safe and supportive environment that fosters positive behavior change and reintegration.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

- This course is designed for youth care workers, correctional officers, social workers, and other professionals working with juvenile and young offenders in detention centers, correctional facilities, or community-based programs.

COURSE OUTLINE

Day 1: Understanding Juvenile and Young Offenders

- Introduction to juvenile and young offenders: definitions and demographics
- Adolescent development: physical, cognitive, emotional, and social changes
- The South African legal context: Child Justice Act, Children's Act, and relevant policies
- Roles of youth care workers: assessment, support, advocacy, and rehabilitation
- Restorative justice: principles, practices, and benefits for young offenders

Day 2: Assessment, Intervention, and Case Management

- Assessment tools and techniques: risk and needs assessment, strengths-based approach
- Individual care planning: goal setting, intervention strategies, and review processes
- Intervention modalities: cognitive-behavioural therapy, motivational interviewing, life skills training
- Case management: documentation, referral pathways, and progress monitoring
- Multi-agency collaboration: working with social workers, probation officers, educators, and families

Day 3: Rehabilitation, Reintegration, and Ethical Practice

- Rehabilitation programmes: anger management, substance abuse, and social skills
- Reintegration planning: family reunification, community resources, and aftercare
- Ethics in youth care: confidentiality, consent, dual relationships, and cultural sensitivity
- Outcome evaluation: measuring progress, recidivism reduction, and programme effectiveness
- Worker well-being: stress management, debriefing, and supervision

ASSESSMENT & CERTIFICATION

Delegates are assessed through exercises and a final test. A mark of **50% or above** earns an **AATICD Certificate of Completion**, issued digitally with a unique verification code. This course carries **6 NQF credits** at **NQF Level 4**.
