COURSE OUTLINE

Day 1: Fundamentals of Quality Control in Tobacco Processing

- Overview of tobacco processing operations and quality control principles
- Quality parameters: moisture content, nicotine, fill value, and visual defects
- Sampling methods and sample preparation for laboratory testing
- Introduction to testing equipment: moisture meters, nicotine analyzers, and density gauges
- Statistical process control: control charts and capability indices
- Documentation and traceability in quality control records
- Common quality issues: mold, off-odors, and physical contamination
- Regulatory requirements and industry standards for tobacco products

Day 2: Advanced Quality Control Implementation and Practical Application

- In-process quality control: monitoring during cutting, drying, and blending
- Final product inspection: packaging integrity, weight, and labeling
- Root cause analysis of quality defects and corrective action plans
- Calibration and maintenance of quality control equipment
- Quality control documentation: batch records, deviation reports, and certificates
- Supplier quality management and incoming material inspection
- Continuous improvement tools: PDCA, Six Sigma, and lean principles
- Case studies: troubleshooting quality issues in tobacco processing

ASSESSMENT & CERTIFICATION
