It focuses on understanding crime patterns, risk assessment, and practical strategies to reduce victimisation, thereby enhancing safety and security.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

- Explain the principles of crime prevention and victimisation reduction within a South African context.

- Implement victimisation reduction strategies, including support referral mechanisms.

COURSE OUTLINE

Day 1: Foundations of Crime Prevention and Victimisation

- Definition and scope of crime prevention and victimisation.
- Overview of crime statistics and trends in South Africa.
- Impact of crime on victims, families, and communities.
- Key stakeholders: SAPS, community policing forums, NGOs, and local government.
- Theoretical foundations: routine activity theory, crime prevention through environmental design (CPTED), and social crime prevention.
- Ethical considerations in crime prevention work.

Day 2: Risk Assessment and Victim Profiling

- Principles of risk assessment in crime prevention.
- Vulnerability factors: age, gender, socio-economic status, location.
- Crime mapping and hotspot analysis.
- Victim profiling techniques: repeat victimisation, near-repeat patterns.
- Practical exercise: risk assessment of a neighbourhood.
- Ethical use of data and confidentiality.

Day 3: Designing and Implementing Prevention Programmes

- Programme design cycle: needs assessment, planning, implementation, evaluation.
- Types of interventions: situational, social, and community-based.
- Case studies of successful crime prevention programmes in South Africa.
- Resource mobilisation and budgeting.
- Monitoring tools: surveys, crime data analysis, feedback mechanisms.
- Role-play: stakeholder engagement meeting.

Day 4: Victim Support and Reduction Strategies

- Victimology: psychological and social effects of crime.
- Legal framework: Victim's Charter, restorative justice.
- Trauma-informed care principles.
- Support services: counselling, legal aid, shelter referrals.
- Designing victim reduction programmes: target hardening, awareness campaigns.
- Evaluating victim support: outcome indicators and feedback loops.
- Practical exercise: developing a victim support plan.

Day 5: Integration, Evaluation, and Professional Practice

- Synthesis of course content: linking theory to practice.
- Evaluation methodologies: quantitative and qualitative approaches.
- Ethical dilemmas in crime prevention work.
- Professional development and networking opportunities.
- Final project presentations: group-based crime prevention plan.
- Peer feedback and reflection.
- Course wrap-up and certification guidance.
