Participants will develop skills to critically evaluate modern issues through a doctrinal lens and communicate these insights effectively in diverse settings.

- Analyze the core tenets of Christian doctrines including the Trinity, incarnation, atonement, and resurrection.
- Apply doctrinal principles to contemporary ethical dilemmas such as bioethics, social justice, and environmental stewardship.
- Evaluate the relevance of eschatological teachings in addressing modern existential and societal concerns.
- Demonstrate the ability to articulate doctrinal concepts in a clear, contextualised manner within diverse public forums.
- Design a practical framework for integrating Christian doctrine into personal, professional, and community life.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

- This training is designed for pastors, ministry leaders, theology students, and lay Christians who seek to engage with modern culture while remaining grounded in orthodox Christian beliefs.

COURSE OUTLINE

Day 1: Introduction to Christian Doctrines and Their Relevance Today

- Overview of core Christian doctrines (Trinity, Incarnation, Atonement, Resurrection).
- The role of Scripture as the primary source of doctrine.
- Historical creeds and confessions (Apostles' Creed, Nicene Creed).
- The relationship between doctrine, culture, and context.
- Case studies: How early church fathers addressed cultural issues.

Day 2: The Doctrine of God: Trinity and Providence in Modern Life

- Biblical basis for the Trinity.
- Understanding God's sovereignty and human responsibility.
- Trinitarian ethics: reflecting God's nature in society.
- Providence vs. fatalism: making choices in an uncertain world.
- Engaging with atheism and secularism in the workplace.

Day 3: Christology: The Person and Work of Jesus Christ

- The incarnation: God with us.
- Theories of atonement (substitutionary, Christus Victor, moral influence).
- The resurrection as foundation for hope and ethics.
- Christ as model for leadership and service.
- Interfaith dialogue: witnessing without compromise.

Day 4: Pneumatology: The Holy Spirit in Contemporary Experience

- The Holy Spirit as comforter, teacher, and empowerer.
- Fruit of the Spirit in personal and professional relationships.
- Spiritual gifts: identification and exercise in community.
- The Spirit and social justice: prophetic voice in society.
- Testing the spirits: discernment in a pluralistic age.

Day 5: Soteriology: Salvation and Transformation

- Grace as unmerited favour and transformative power.
- Faith and works: integrating belief and action.
- Sanctification: growing in holiness in a secular world.
- Identity in Christ: overcoming shame and guilt.
- Salvation and social transformation: addressing inequality.

Day 6: Ecclesiology: The Church as Community and Agent of Change

- The church as body of Christ and people of God.
- Marks of the church: unity, holiness, catholicity, apostolicity.
- Church leadership: elders, deacons, and shared ministry.
- The church in the public square: advocacy and service.
- Contemporary ecclesial movements: house churches, megachurches.

Day 7: Eschatology: Hope and Responsibility for the Future

- The Kingdom of God: already and not yet.
- Resurrection and the new creation.
- Heaven, hell, and judgement: pastoral implications.
- Eschatology and ecology: stewardship of creation.

- Living in light of Christ's return: urgency without fanaticism.

Day 8: Applied Doctrine: Ethics, Work, and Culture

- Biblical ethics: from doctrine to daily choices.
- Vocation as calling: serving God in the marketplace.
- Engaging with popular culture: discernment and creativity.
- Doctrine and social issues: poverty, racism, gender.
- Contextualisation: translating doctrine into local idioms.

Day 9: Synthesis and Practical Integration

- Recap and integration of all doctrines.
- Developing a personal rule of faith.
- Teaching doctrines to various audiences.
- Doctrine and spiritual disciplines: prayer, worship, community.
- Final project presentation: applying a doctrine to a modern issue.

ASSESSMENT & CERTIFICATION

Delegates are assessed through exercises and a final test. A mark of **50% or above** earns an **AATICD Certificate of Completion**, issued digitally with a unique verification code. This course carries **12 NQF credits** at **NQF Level 6**.
