COURSE OUTLINE

Day 1: Historical and Cultural Context of 1st Century Palestine

- Overview of 1st century Palestine under Roman rule.
- Jewish religious sects and their beliefs.
- Socio-economic conditions and daily life.
- The role of the Torah and oral tradition.
- Messianic expectations and apocalyptic thought.

Day 2: Sources and Methods for Studying Jesus

- Canonical Gospels: Matthew, Mark, Luke, John.
- Non-canonical sources: Gospel of Thomas, Josephus, Tacitus.
- Historical methods: source, form, redaction, and narrative criticism.
- The synoptic problem and two-source hypothesis.
- Criteria for historical authenticity.

Day 3: Birth and Early Life of Jesus

- Annunciation and virgin birth.
- Genealogies in Matthew and Luke.
- Shepherds, magi, and the star.
- Presentation in the Temple and Simeon/Anna.
- Jesus' childhood: the Temple incident at age 12.

Day 4: Baptism, Temptation, and Early Ministry

- John the Baptist: message and baptism.
- Jesus' baptism: divine approval and anointing.
- Temptation in the wilderness: testing and obedience.
- Calling of the first disciples.
- First miracles: water to wine, healing at Capernaum.

Day 5: Teachings of Jesus: Parables and Sermons

- Parables of the Kingdom: sower, mustard seed, pearl.
- Parables of grace: prodigal son, good Samaritan.
- Sermon on the Mount: Beatitudes, Lord's Prayer.
- Teaching on the Law, forgiveness, and wealth.
- Parables of judgment: rich fool, ten virgins.

Day 6: Miracles and Healings of Jesus

- Nature miracles: calming the storm, feeding 5000.
- Healing miracles: blind, lame, lepers.
- Exorcisms and the kingdom of God.
- Raising the dead: Jairus' daughter, Lazarus.
- Reactions to miracles: belief and opposition.

Day 7: Opposition, Conflict, and the Journey to Jerusalem

- Conflicts with Pharisees: Sabbath healing, hand washing.
- Controversy over authority and temple actions.
- Peter's confession and the transfiguration.
- Prediction of suffering and discipleship demands.

- Triumphal entry and cleansing of the Temple.

Day 8: Arrest, Trial, Crucifixion, and Burial

- Last Supper: institution of the Eucharist.
- Gethsemane: prayer and arrest.
- Trial before Sanhedrin and Pilate.
- Crucifixion: process, death, and darkness.
- Burial by Joseph of Arimathea and tomb.

Day 9: Resurrection, Appearances, and Ascension

- Empty tomb accounts and angelic announcements.
- Appearances to Mary Magdalene, disciples, and Paul.
- Theological meaning: victory over death, new creation.
- Great Commission and ascension.
- Practical integration: applying Jesus' life and ministry today.
