WHO SHOULD ATTEND

COURSE OUTLINE

Day 1: Foundations of Christian Doctrine and Its Role in the Church

- What is Christian doctrine? Scripture, tradition, reason, experience.
- Core doctrines: Trinity, incarnation, atonement, resurrection.
- The role of doctrine in worship, teaching, and fellowship.
- Doctrine as a framework for Christian living.
- Historical development of key doctrines.
- The relationship between doctrine and church unity.

Day 2: Doctrine of God and Humanity – Implications for Church Life

- The Trinity: unity and diversity as a model for community.
- God's attributes: holiness, love, justice, and mercy.

- Implications for leadership: servant leadership and shared authority.
- Human dignity and equality in the church.
- Using Trinitarian theology to resolve conflict.

Day 3: Christology and Soteriology – Shaping Worship and Mission

- Christology: Jesus as fully God and fully man.
- Atonement theories: substitution, Christus Victor, moral influence.
- Salvation: grace, faith, justification, sanctification.
- Worship as response to Christ's work.
- The Great Commission and social responsibility.
- Sacraments as means of grace.

Day 4: Pneumatology – The Holy Spirit in Church and Society

- The Holy Spirit: deity, roles, and gifts.
- Fruit of the Spirit and character formation.
- Spiritual gifts for edification and service.
- The Spirit's role in unity and diversity.
- Empowerment for witness and social justice.
- Discerning the Spirit in cultural contexts.

Day 5: Ecclesiology – The Nature and Mission of the Church

- Biblical images of the church: body, bride, vine.
- Marks of the church and their practical outworking.
- Church governance models: episcopal, presbyterian, congregational.
- The church as a counter-cultural community.
- Mission: evangelism and social action.
- Church discipline and restorative justice.

Day 6: Christian Ethics – Applying Doctrine to Moral Issues in Society

- Foundations of Christian ethics: creation, fall, redemption.
- Ethical issues: bioethics, marriage, sexuality, poverty, environment.
- The role of the church in public discourse.
- Justice, mercy, and humility in society.
- Religious freedom and pluralism.

- Case studies: applying doctrine to real-world dilemmas.

Day 7: Integration and Practical Application – Doctrine in Daily Life

- Recap and synthesis of doctrinal themes.
- Developing a doctrinal statement for a local church.
- Teaching doctrine: methods for adults, youth, and children.
- Doctrine and church culture: fostering a learning community.
- Assessing the church's social engagement through a doctrinal lens.
- Personal action plan for lifelong doctrinal formation.
- Course evaluation and certification.
