- Christianity in neighbouring countries: Botswana, Zimbabwe, Mozambique.
- Gender, sexuality, and the church in contemporary contexts.
- Faith-based organisations and community development.
- Oral history and preserving local Christian heritage.
- Practical exercise: analysing a case study of a regional church.
- Assessment preparation: portfolio evidence and reflection.
