COURSE OVERVIEW

This course equips participants with the knowledge and skills to provide guidance on the integrated management of common childhood illnesses and home accidents. It focuses on early identification, appropriate response, and referral strategies to improve child health outcomes and prevent injuries in the home environment.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

- Apply principles of integrated management of childhood illnesses to identify common childhood conditions.
- Demonstrate correct procedures for managing childhood home accidents, including poisoning, burns, and falls.
- Evaluate signs and symptoms of childhood illnesses to determine appropriate action or referral.
- Implement preventive measures to reduce the risk of childhood home accidents.
- Communicate guidance effectively to caregivers and families on managing childhood illnesses and accidents.
- Analyze case scenarios to integrate knowledge of illness management and accident prevention.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

- This course is designed for community health workers, childcare providers, home-based care workers, and any individuals responsible for the care and safety of children in home or community settings.

COURSE OUTLINE

Day 1: Foundations of IMCI and Childhood Illnesses

- Introduction to IMCI: history, objectives, and SAQA alignment.
- Common childhood illnesses: diarrhoea, pneumonia, malaria, measles, malnutrition.
- Danger signs: inability to drink, convulsions, lethargy, severe dehydration.
- IMCI assessment steps: check, classify, treat, counsel.
- Home care management: feeding, hygiene, medication adherence.
- Case study: assessing a child with cough and fever.

Day 2: Childhood Home Accidents: Prevention and First Response

- Types of home accidents: falls, burns, poisoning, choking, drowning.
- Risk factors: age, environment, supervision gaps.
- Prevention measures: childproofing, safe storage, supervision.
- First aid basics: wound care, burns, choking maneuvers, poisoning response.
- When to seek emergency care: signs of head injury, severe bleeding.
- Practical exercise: creating a home safety checklist.

Day 3: Integrating IMCI and Accident Prevention in Caregiving

- Holistic child health: linking illness management and accident prevention.
- Caregiver counseling: communication techniques, health education.
- Integrated assessment: combining IMCI with home safety checks.
- Developing a care plan: medical treatment, home safety, nutrition.
- Follow-up strategies: monitoring recovery and re-injury prevention.
- Role-play: counseling a mother on managing a sick child and preventing accidents.

Day 4: Practical Application and Case Management

- Simulated patient scenarios: assessing a child with diarrhoea and dehydration.
- Case study: child with fever and suspected malaria, plus home fall risk.
- First aid drills: treating burns, performing CPR on a child.
- Group work: developing an integrated care plan for a complex case.
- Discussion: adapting IMCI and safety advice for low-resource homes.
- Quiz: classifying illnesses and identifying danger signs.

Day 5: Community Engagement, Monitoring, and Evaluation

- Community health worker roles: education, referral, follow-up.
- Monitoring tools: growth charts, home safety checklists, illness logs.
- Evaluation methods: assessing outcomes, caregiver feedback.
- Ethics and culture: respecting beliefs, ensuring confidentiality.
- Outreach planning: designing a community session on IMCI and accident prevention.
- Course review and mock assessment.
- Certification requirements and next steps.

ASSESSMENT & CERTIFICATION

Delegates are assessed through exercises and a final test. A mark of **50% or above** earns an **AATICD Certificate of Completion**, issued digitally with a unique verification code. This course carries **8 NQF credits** at **NQF Level 2**.
