- Funding flows: contributions, risk-pooling, reinsurance, and claims processing
- Roles of intermediaries: risk management, benefit design, provider networks, and cost containment
- Current challenges: affordability, fraud, regulatory uncertainty, and access disparities
- Case study: analysis of a medical scheme's funding model and intermediary involvement
