This course equips learners with the skills to identify and assess risk factors that contribute to crime and victimisation in various contexts. Participants will learn to apply specific techniques to analyse environments, behaviours, and systems to reduce vulnerabilities and enhance safety.

- Apply specific techniques to identify risk factors contributing to crime and victimisation.

COURSE OUTLINE

Day 1: Introduction to Crime and Victimisation Risk Factors

- Overview of crime and victimisation in South Africa.
- Types of risk factors: individual, community, societal.
- Introduction to routine activity theory and lifestyle exposure.
- Social disorganisation and its impact on crime.
- Economic inequality and crime correlation.
- Environmental criminology: Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) basics.

Day 2: Data Collection Methods for Risk Factor Identification

- Designing interview questions for victimisation experiences.
- Survey instruments for community safety perception.
- Systematic social observation techniques.
- Analysing police crime data and victimisation surveys.
- Ethical considerations in data collection.
- Practical exercise: Mock data collection scenario.

Day 3: Analysing Risk Factors: Tools and Frameworks

- Crime mapping and Geographic Information Systems (GIS) basics.
- Risk assessment matrices and scoring.
- Analysing repeat victimisation patterns.
- Identifying high-risk locations and times.
- Case study: Analysis of a local crime dataset.
- Group work: Creating a risk factor profile.

Day 4: Specific Techniques for Victimisation Risk Assessment

- Victimisation survey design and administration.
- Vulnerability assessment frameworks (e.g., for domestic violence).
- Risk factors for specific crimes: robbery, sexual assault, burglary.
- Repeat victimisation: causes and prevention.
- Practical: Administering a victimisation risk checklist.
- Role-play: Interviewing a victim to identify risk factors.

Day 5: Community-Based Risk Factor Identification

- Community mapping of crime 'hotspots' and safe zones.
- Focus group facilitation techniques.
- Stakeholder engagement: police, community leaders, NGOs.
- Participatory risk assessment methods.
- Case study: Community safety audit.
- Practical: Conduct a mini community mapping exercise.

Day 6: Integrating Findings into Crime Prevention Strategies

- Linking risk factors to intervention types (situational, social, developmental).
- Designing a targeted intervention (e.g., neighbourhood watch, CCTV).
- Cost-benefit analysis of prevention strategies.
- Monitoring and evaluation of crime prevention programmes.
- Group work: Drafting a prevention plan for a given scenario.

Day 7: Practical Application and Integration

- Compiling a risk assessment report: structure and content.
- Presentation skills for stakeholders.
- Ethical dilemmas in risk factor identification.
- Integration with existing organisational procedures.
- Final project: Present a risk assessment and prevention plan.
- Course evaluation and certification.

ASSESSMENT & CERTIFICATION
