Day 1: Understanding Crime and Victimisation

- Victimisation risk factors: socio-economic, environmental, and behavioural.
- The concept of repeat victimisation.
- Impact of crime on victims (physical, psychological, financial).
- Community perceptions of crime and safety.
- Introduction to crime prevention theories.

Day 2: Theoretical Frameworks for Crime Prevention

- Situational crime prevention: opportunity reduction and CPTED.
- Social crime prevention: community development and education.
- Routine activity theory and rational choice theory.
- Environmental criminology and crime pattern theory.
- Problem-oriented policing and community policing.
- Developmental crime prevention: early intervention.
- Case studies of successful crime prevention programmes.
- Critiques and limitations of theoretical models.

Day 3: Risk Assessment and Analysis

- Risk assessment methodologies: quantitative and qualitative.
- Crime mapping and geographic information systems (GIS).
- Data sources: police statistics, victim surveys, community reports.
- Identifying crime hotspots and temporal patterns.
- Risk factors for specific crime types (e.g., burglary, assault).
- Vulnerability assessment: individuals, groups, and locations.
- Ethical issues: confidentiality, stigmatisation, and bias.
- Practical exercise: conducting a mini risk assessment.

Day 4: Designing a Strategic Programme

- Strategic planning models and logic models.
- Defining programme goals, objectives, and outcomes.
- Stakeholder analysis and community engagement.
- Resource mobilisation: funding, personnel, and materials.
- Developing a monitoring and evaluation framework.
- Risk management in programme design.
- Communication strategies for public awareness.
- Workshop: drafting a programme outline.

Day 5: Implementing and Managing Crime Prevention Initiatives

- Project management basics: scope, time, cost, quality.
- Roles and responsibilities of partners (police, NGOs, local government).
- Capacity building and training for staff and volunteers.
- Managing community expectations and participation.
- Legal considerations: constitutional rights, by-laws.

- Policy alignment: National Crime Prevention Strategy.
- Dealing with resistance and conflict.
- Case study: implementation challenges and solutions.

Day 6: Monitoring, Evaluation, and Learning

- M&E; frameworks: indicators, data sources, frequency.
- Quantitative and qualitative data collection methods.
- Outcome and impact evaluation designs.
- Data analysis techniques for crime prevention.
- Reporting formats: dashboards, reports, presentations.
- Using M&E; for adaptive management.
- Learning from failures and successes.
- Practical exercise: developing an M&E; plan.

Day 7: Integration, Presentation, and Certification

- Final project: design a complete strategic programme.
- Presentation skills and pitching to stakeholders.
- Peer review and feedback sessions.
- Panel Q&A; and defence of proposals.
- Course recap and key takeaways.
- Assessment preparation: unit standard requirements.

- Course evaluation and closure.
