It aims to develop a holistic understanding of crime causation to enhance personal and organisational safety strategies within the South African context.

- Explain individual factors (e.g., biological, psychological, and behavioural traits) that contribute to criminal behaviour and victimisation.
- Analyse social factors (e.g., poverty, inequality, peer influence, and community disorganisation) that influence crime rates and victimisation patterns.
- Evaluate corporate factors (e.g., organisational culture, negligence, and inadequate security measures) that facilitate crime and victimisation in the workplace.
- Apply knowledge of crime causation to develop preventative strategies for reducing victimisation risk.
- Demonstrate understanding of the interplay between individual, social, and corporate factors in specific crime scenarios.
- Assess the impact of crime on victims and recommend appropriate support mechanisms.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

- This course is intended for security officers, safety representatives, human resources professionals, and any individuals responsible for crime prevention or victim support in corporate or community settings.

COURSE OUTLINE

Day 1: Foundations of Crime and Victimisation

- Introduction to criminology and victimology.
- Legal definitions of crime and victimisation in SA.
- Overview of crime statistics and trends.
- The concept of victimisation: direct and indirect.
- Introduction to individual, social, and corporate factors.
- Case study: High-profile crimes and victim impact.

Day 2: Individual Factors Contributing to Crime

- Biological theories: genetics, neurochemistry.
- Psychological theories: personality disorders, psychopathy.
- Substance abuse and crime.
- Trauma and adverse childhood experiences.
- Individual victimisation risk factors.
- Case studies: Offender profiles.

Day 3: Social Factors Contributing to Crime

- Strain theory and anomie.
- Social disorganisation theory.
- Differential association and social learning.
- Poverty and economic inequality.
- Family dysfunction and peer influence.
- Cultural factors: violence normalisation, gang culture.
- Community-based crime prevention.

Day 4: Corporate Factors Contributing to Crime

- Types of corporate crime: fraud, bribery, environmental crimes.
- Organisational culture and unethical behaviour.
- Corporate governance and compliance failures.
- Corruption in public and private sectors.
- Victimisation from corporate crime.
- Case studies: Notable SA corporate crimes.

Day 5: Victimisation and Victimology

- Victim precipitation theory.
- Lifestyle and routine activities theory.
- Vulnerable populations: women, children, elderly.
- Repeat victimisation and fear of crime.
- Psychological and economic impact of victimisation.
- Victim rights framework in SA.
- Support services: shelters, counselling, legal aid.

Day 6: Interplay of Factors and Prevention Strategies

- Interaction of factors: case examples.
- Primary, secondary, and tertiary prevention.
- Situational crime prevention.

- Restorative justice principles and practices.
- Community policing and partnerships.
- Corporate social responsibility and ethics programmes.
- Workshop: Developing a prevention plan.

Day 7: Application, Integration, and Assessment

- Review of key concepts.
- Advanced case study analysis: multi-factor approach.
- Developing a victim support and crime prevention programme.
- Ethical considerations in crime and victimisation work.
- Final assessment: written and practical.
- Course evaluation and feedback.
- Certification guidance and next steps.
