This course equips learners with the skills to evaluate the effectiveness of a crime and victimisation strategy programme aimed at reducing risk. Participants will learn to assess programme outcomes, identify gaps, and recommend improvements to enhance safety and security within organisations and communities. The focus is on applying systematic evaluation methods to ensure strategies are evidence-based and impactful.

COURSE OUTLINE

Day 1: Understanding Crime and Victimisation Frameworks

- Overview of crime types and victimisation patterns
- Theoretical frameworks: routine activity theory, rational choice theory
- Impact of crime: physical, psychological, social, economic
- Introduction to crime prevention strategies
- Stakeholders: SAPS, community forums, NGOs, social development
- Relevant South African legislation: Criminal Procedure Act, Victims' Charter

Day 2: Programme Design and Logic Models

- Elements of a programme: goals, objectives, activities, resources
- Logic models: inputs, outputs, outcomes, impact
- Developing SMART indicators
- Programme theory: causal pathways and assumptions
- Needs assessment and community profiling
- Case study: review of an existing South African crime prevention programme

Day 3: Data Collection for Programme Evaluation

- Evaluation types: formative, process, outcome, impact
- Quantitative methods: surveys, crime statistics analysis
- Qualitative methods: interviews, focus groups, observation
- Ethical considerations: informed consent, confidentiality
- Sampling strategies: random, purposive, snowball
- Data collection tools: questionnaires, interview guides, checklists

Day 4: Analysing and Interpreting Evaluation Data

- Quantitative analysis: descriptive statistics, frequency distributions
- Qualitative analysis: coding, theme identification
- Triangulation: combining data for validity
- Identifying gaps and unintended outcomes
- Interpreting results against indicators
- Practical exercise: analyse sample evaluation data

Day 5: Reporting and Communicating Evaluation Findings

- Report components: executive summary, methodology, findings, recommendations
- Writing for different stakeholders: funders, community, policymakers
- Visual presentation: graphs, charts, infographics
- Recommendations: prioritisation and feasibility
- Feedback loops and programme adaptation
- Example: critique a real evaluation report

Day 6: Advanced Evaluation Approaches and Risk Reduction Strategies

- Evaluation designs: RCTs, pre-post, comparison groups
- Measuring risk reduction: recidivism rates, victimisation surveys
- Victim-centred evaluation: sensitivity, empowerment
- Challenges: attribution, confounding variables, resource constraints
- Participatory evaluation: involving community members

- Theory-driven evaluation: testing causal mechanisms

Day 7: Integration, Practical Application, and Assessment

- Group project: design and present an evaluation plan
- Peer feedback and critique
- Practical assessment: data analysis exercise
- Ethical dilemmas and problem-solving
- Recap of key learning points
- Assessment preparation: portfolio of evidence, knowledge test
