COURSE OUTLINE

Day 1: Foundations of Globalisation and Military Affairs

- Introduction to globalisation: definitions and historical context.
- Dimensions of globalisation: political, economic, social, technological.
- Global actors: UN, AU, NATO, BRICS, and their roles.
- Southern Africa in the global security landscape.
- Military interdependence: alliances, coalitions, and joint operations.
- Overview of global security threats: terrorism, cyber threats, pandemics.

Day 2: Geopolitical and Economic Impacts on Southern African Military Affairs

- Geopolitical hotspots: Middle East, Asia, and their influence on Africa.
- Economic globalisation: trade dependencies, sanctions, and defence budgets.
- Natural resource competition: oil, minerals, and water security.
- Foreign military presence and bases in Africa.
- Arms trade and technology transfer: implications for Southern Africa.
- Case study: SADC responses to regional conflicts.

Day 3: Technological and Information Warfare Impacts

- Technological globalisation: cyber, AI, drones, and space.
- Cyber warfare: threats to national security and military infrastructure.
- Information warfare: propaganda, fake news, and psychological operations.
- Space security: satellite communications and surveillance.
- Defence technology transfer and local innovation in Southern Africa.
- Case study: Cyber attacks on African military networks.

Day 4: Legal, Ethical, and Human Security Dimensions

- International humanitarian law: Geneva Conventions and rules of engagement.
- Ethical dilemmas: civilian protection, drone strikes, and mercenaries.
- Human security: refugees, child soldiers, and gender-based violence.
- Peacekeeping operations: UN and AU missions in Southern Africa.
- Regional security cooperation: SADC Standby Force and African Capacity for Immediate Response to Crises.
- Case study: Mozambique insurgency and regional response.

Day 5: Strategic Integration and Practical Application

- Strategic integration: linking global trends to national defence strategies.
- Policy recommendations for Southern African militaries.
- Scenario planning: responding to a global crisis affecting the region.
- Group exercise: developing a briefing on a selected global aspect.
- Presentation of group work and feedback.
- Course review and action planning for implementation.
