This course equips nursing professionals with the skills to implement and evaluate planned nursing care to achieve identified patient outcomes. Participants will learn to apply evidence-based interventions, monitor patient progress, and adjust care plans to optimize recovery and quality of life. The focus is on systematic evaluation and continuous improvement of nursing care delivery.

- SBAR communication technique.

Day 6: Evaluating Patient Outcomes

- Measuring patient satisfaction and quality of life.
- Clinical indicators and benchmarks.
- Data analysis for outcome evaluation.
- Root cause analysis for unmet outcomes.

- Documentation of evaluation findings.

- Quality improvement frameworks (e.g., Plan-Do-Study-Act).
- Clinical audits and performance indicators.
- Root cause analysis and action planning.
- Change management models.
- Role of nursing in patient safety.

Day 8: Evidence-Based Practice and Research Utilization

- Steps of evidence-based practice.
- PICO (Population, Intervention, Comparison, Outcome) question formulation.
- Database searching and critical appraisal.
- Levels of evidence and study designs.
- Translating evidence into practice.
- Overcoming barriers to EBP.

Day 9: Interprofessional Collaboration and Communication

- Principles of interprofessional collaboration.
- Team roles and responsibilities.
- Effective communication strategies (e.g., ISBAR).
- Conducting care conferences.
- Conflict resolution techniques.
- Documentation for interdisciplinary communication.

Day 10: Patient Education and Self-Management Support

- Learning theories and health literacy.
- Teaching strategies for diverse populations.
- Developing education materials (e.g., pamphlets, videos).
- Self-management support for chronic diseases.
- Motivational interviewing techniques.
- Evaluating patient education outcomes.

Day 11: Ethical and Legal Issues in Nursing Care

- Ethical principles: autonomy, beneficence, non-maleficence, justice.
- Ethical decision-making models.
- Informed consent and refusal of treatment.
- Confidentiality and privacy laws.
- Scope of practice and professional boundaries.
- Advocacy and patient rights.

- SOAP (Subjective, Objective, Assessment, Plan) notes.
- Nursing care plans and flowcharts.
- Electronic health record systems.
- Reporting for quality indicators.
- Legal implications of documentation.

Day 13: Capstone Integration and Final Assessment

- Case study analysis and presentation.
- Developing an evaluation plan for a patient scenario.
- Peer review and feedback.
- Course review and key takeaways.
- Action plan for applying learning in practice.
- Final assessment (written or practical).
