COURSE OVERVIEW

This course equips learners with the skills to identify and analyze crime and victimisation trends and patterns across specific crime types. Participants will learn to interpret crime data, recognise victimisation profiles, and apply this knowledge to enhance safety strategies within corporate environments. The course aims to foster a proactive approach to crime prevention and victim support.

Day 1: Foundations of Crime and Victimisation Trends

- Key terminology: prevalence, incidence, dark figure of crime
- Overview of official crime statistics: SAPS annual reports
- Victimisation surveys: Victims of Crime Survey (VOCS)
- Types of crime: contact, property, sexual, and economic
- The impact of crime on victims and communities
- Introduction to data reliability and validity issues

Day 2: Data Sources and Collection Methods

- Detailed review of SAPS crime statistics: reporting and recording processes
- Victimisation survey methodology: sampling, questionnaire design, and fieldwork
- Alternative data sources: NGOs, community surveys, insurance data
- Issues of underreporting and non-response bias
- Ethical considerations in victimisation research
- Practical exercise: Analysing a sample dataset from SAPS

Day 3: Analytical Techniques for Trend Identification

- Descriptive statistics: mean, median, mode, standard deviation
- Time-series analysis: seasonal and long-term trends
- Geospatial analysis basics: crime mapping concepts
- Using Excel for crime data analysis: pivot tables, charts
- Comparative analysis: urban vs. rural, provincial differences
- Practical exercise: Trend analysis using provided datasets

Day 4: Victimisation Patterns and Risk Factors

- Demographic patterns: age, gender, race, and income
- Repeat victimisation: prevalence and risk factors
- Lifestyle and routine activities theory
- Victimisation in specific settings: domestic violence, business crime
- Fear of crime: measurement and impact on behaviour
- Case studies: Analysing VOCS data on victimisation risk

Day 5: Reporting, Interpretation, and Policy Implications

- Structure of a crime trends report: executive summary, methodology, findings
- Interpreting statistical significance and practical relevance
- Translating data into actionable recommendations
- Ethical reporting: avoiding stigmatisation and sensationalism
- Presentation skills: visual and oral communication of trends
- Final group project: Present a trend analysis report
