This course equips learners with the essential knowledge of shipboard safety procedures, enabling them to identify hazards, apply emergency protocols, and contribute to a safe working environment on vessels. It covers key safety regulations, personal protective equipment, and emergency response measures relevant to the maritime industry.

- Apply hazard identification and risk assessment procedures to common shipboard activities.
- Explain emergency response procedures, including fire, abandonment, and medical emergencies.
- Describe the roles and responsibilities of crew members in maintaining safety and responding to emergencies.
- Demonstrate understanding of safety communication systems and signals used in shipboard operations.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

- This course is designed for seafarers, deck and engineering crew, and shore-based personnel who require foundational knowledge of ship safety procedures to comply with industry standards and ensure safe operations.

COURSE OUTLINE

Day 1: Introduction to Ship Safety and Regulatory Framework

- Overview of ship safety: statistics, incidents, and accountability
- International Maritime Organization (IMO) and SOLAS conventions
- South African Maritime Safety Authority (SAMSA) regulations
- Types of hazards: physical, chemical, biological, ergonomic
- Risk assessment basics: hazard identification, risk evaluation, control measures
- Personal protective equipment (PPE): types, selection, maintenance
- Emergency response: fire, abandon ship, man overboard, medical emergencies
- Shipboard alarm signals and muster procedures

Day 2: Practical Application of Ship Safety Procedures

- Fire-fighting equipment: types, operation, maintenance
- Life-saving appliances: lifeboats, liferafts, life jackets, immersion suits
- Emergency drills: planning, execution, debriefing
- Safe working practices: confined space entry, hot work, working aloft
- Manual handling and ergonomics on board
- Hazard reporting and safety communication
- Personal and team safety during emergencies
- Review and assessment of safety knowledge

ASSESSMENT & CERTIFICATION

Delegates are assessed through exercises and a final test. A mark of **50% or above** earns an **AATICD Certificate of Completion**, issued digitally with a unique verification code. This course carries **5 NQF credits** at **NQF Level 4**.
